Chef de Gare's Notes

During the next Prom John will be delivering the State of the Bingo Parlor Report. Utilizing our new accounting software, which we have been running alongside the old system for the past six months, we are now able to track our costs as we have not been in the past. We now know what it costs to open the doors of the Chateau and the Bingo Parlor, thus being able to know what we need to make to break even. I know this all sounds like things we always should have known, but under the old software, provided by our CPA Firm, we did not have the tools we needed.

It is for this reason, that as of the end of the current accounting period, I have asked that our attorney draft a letter terminating out relationship with our current CPA firm. We have three new candidates, and are actively in the process of interviewing them. Anyone with knowledge in this area, please contact John.

Next year will mark the 20th year we have been in our current location, while this is a cause for celebration it is also my biggest concern for Voiture 99. Our maintenance costs, for the upkeep of the two buildings, are going to accelerate. Last month the disposal in the kitchen needed an overhaul, new bearings and blades came to over a thousand dollars. This is why I have asked that a portion of the funds we are now holding in CD's be converted from their original intent to a "sinking fund" dedicated to maintenance of our capital asset. We are working with the Gaming Commission to accomplish this task. At the same time we are going to have to set aside a larger amount of our bingo profits for maintenance. A new roof on the Bingo Parlor would be in the tens of thousands of dollars.

All of this is tied to two upcoming events:

- One; the opening of the Indian Gaming Casino in La Center.
- Two; the current date of our national and local economy, the upcoming elections and the effect they will have them.

I will tell you that I am not as concerned with the Casino as I am with our current economy. Until that turns around, the spending on our current charitable programs is going to have to be kept under tight controls.

The Past Chief's Dinner was a great success. I

would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who helped out. Special thanks to the La Fem's for their assistance with the decorations, and to all those who helped with the set up. Thanks also to Bob Kadow for helping out in the kitchen.

- I would again like to ask all Directors to work with Bill Hauser and set up a tab within the website explaining the purpose of each of your programs. I understand that few of you have taken this simple opportunity to get the word out about your program to the community.

Trivia Answer

The "Miracle on Ice" is the name for a medal-round men's ice hockey game during the 1980 Winter Olympics at Lake Placid, New York, on Friday, February 22. The United States national team, defeated the Soviet Union national team, which had won the gold medal in six of the seven previous Olympic games. Al Michaels' memorable broadcast of this game, including his interjection "Do you believe in miracles? YES!" as time expired on the 4-3 U.S. victory, earned the game the nickname of The Miracle on Ice. In 1999, Sports Illustrated named the "Miracle on Ice" the Top Sports Moment of the 20th Century. Michaels recalled, "When I look back, obviously Lake Placid would be the highlight of my career. I can't think of anything that would ever top it. I can't dream up a scenario."
