

Trivia

Answer: On March 3, 1931, U.S. President Herbert Hoover signed legislation that offi-cially designated "The Star-Spangled Banner" as America's national anthem. For more than a century, the song had grown in popularity among Americans and by the third decade of the 20th century had already become the na-tion's de facto anthem, but with a stroke of the pen, President Hoover made it official. Here are some trivia questions to test your knowl-edge of our national anthem and how it came to be.

"O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave."

In the words of Red Skelton

"I've been listening to you boys and girls recite the Pledge of Allegiance all semester," Said Mr. Laswell, "and it seems as though it is becoming monotonous to you. May I recite it and try to explain to you the meaning of each word?"

<u>"I"</u>— me, an individual, a committee of one.

<u>"Pledge"</u> — dedicate all of my worldly goods to give without self-pity.

"Allegiance" — my love and my devotion.

<u>"To the flag"</u>— our standard, Old Glory, a symbol of freedom. Wherever she waves, there's respect because your loyalty has given her a dignity that shouts freedom is everybody's job!

"Of the United" — that means that we have all come together.

<u>"States of America"</u>— individual communities that have united into 48 great states. Forty-eight individual communities with pride and dignity and purpose; all divided with imaginary boundaries, yet united to a common purpose, and that's love for country.

<u>"And to the republic"</u>— a state in which sovereign power is invested in representatives chosen by the people to govern. And government is the people and it's from the people to the leaders, not from the leaders to the people.

"For which it stands, one nation"— one nation, meaning "so blessed by God."

"Indivisible" — incapable of being divided.

<u>"With liberty"</u>— which is freedom— the right of power to live one's own life without threats, fear or some sort of retaliation.

<u>"And justice"</u> — the principle or quality of dealing fairly with others.

<u>"For all"</u> — which means, boys and girls, it's as much your country as it
